CHAPTER DONATES PALLIATIVES TO IDP CAMP

The NSChE, FCT and the Nasarawa Chapter has joined the fight against COVID-19 to honour the memory of Engineer Suleiman Achimugu, the first victim of Coronavirus pandemic in Nigeria. Achimugu, the former Managing Director of the Pipeline and Product Marketing Company, PPMC, a subsidiary of the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation, NNPC, died shortly after he visited the United Kingdom and was diagnosed of coronavirus.

Speaking at the new Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camp in Kuchingara in Abuja on the 22nd April 2020, Dr. Boniface Wada, who is the Chairman of the COVID-19 Committee FCT-Nasarawa Chapter, said the duration of items which include foodstuff, sanitizers, disinfectant detergent and clothing was aimed at alleviating the suffering of Nigerians during the period

of the lockdown. He said that donating to this IDP camp was to identify with the needy and assist the government in combating the spread of the pandemic and therefore appealed that the items be used and shared fairly. The Chapter Chairman, Engr. Onyekachi Onyugi and Engr. Ben Akwaaz also appealed to displaced persons to ensure coronavirus was not spread among them.

Receiving the donated items, the Chairman of the IDP camp, Mr. Petermon Emmanuel, thanked the Chapter for remembering the needy in their midst and expressed gratitude for the donation. He called on other organizations in the country to reach out to the needy during this period of lockdown, saying that many families are not finding it easy to cope with the present situation. PUBLIC LECTURE TO COMMEMORATE WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY 2020

The Nigerian Society of Chemical Engineers (NSCHE) FCT-Nasarawa Chapter joined the rest of the world to celebrate the World Environment Day (WED) on the 5th June 2020 by organising a virtual Public Lecture titled "Biodiversity and Resilience of Ecosystem Functions: The Role of Engineering" in response to 2020 WED Theme which calls for urgent action to protect biodiversity.

Life on earth would not be possible without nature's services. For example, it provides us with oxygen, purifies the water we drink, fertilizes the soil and produces the variety of foods we require to stay healthy and resist disease. It offers substances for developing medicines and provides foundation of most industries and livelihoods while helping to mitigate the impact of climate change by storing carbon and regulating local rainfall. However with our increasing demands humans have pushed nature beyond its limit thereby contributing to biodiversity loss. In the last 50 years, the human population has doubled, the global economy has almost quadrupled and globe trade has increased by about ten times. It would take 1.5 Earths to meet the

demands that humans make of nature each year. The emergence of COVID-19 has underscored the fact that when we destroy biodiversity, we destroy the system that supports human life. By upsetting the delicate balance of nature, we have created ideal conditions for pathogenic - including coronaviruses to spread.

Engineering harnesses natural resources to make human lives safe and convenient. Living as we know it today would not have been possible without engineering. Engineering is playing important roles in all aspects of human life - infrastructure, energy, medicine, communications, agriculture, etc. Hence, engineering has one of the biggest roles in biodiversity protection as we seek to attain equilibrium living in harmony with nature.

Speaking during the lecture, the Guest Speaker, Dr. Isoma Vincent Akpu, Associate Professor, Department of Animal and Environmental Biology, University of Port Harcourt explained biodiversity functions for humanity, the prior to biodiversity and closing the gap between engineering and ecology. According to her, biodiversity stimulates technological innovation and provides framework for

sustainable development for engineers. Major threats to biodiversity include habitat change, invasive alien species, over-exploitation of natural resources, pollution, climate change, global warming and underlying socio-cultural conditions among others. These threats from human activities are putting strain on the natural functions of biodiversity and its ability to sustain future generations. If species are not able to adapt to intensified threats or disturbances, the maintenance of biodiversity and sustainable provision of ecosystem services to humanity will decline and cease to occur in future.

Taking critical analyses of the roles of engineering in all these, the forum agreed that there is need to close gap between engineering and ecology. Environmental impact of any project must be taken into serious consideration and constantly reviewed during conception and execution the project. To this end, there must be synergy among professional disciplines and review of academic curricular to incorporate more courses and makes researches focused on practical solutions to human problems. Furthermore, there should be

enforcement of extant laws both international and local.

The Public Lecture which was chaired by Engr. Onochie A. Anyasuru FNSCIE FNSE FASing (National President of NSCIE) witnessed about 100 participants who joined from their homes or offices. Tokur Muhammed Lawal MNSCIE Senior GM, Environment and Community Affairs of Dangote Cement Plc Global) constituted the panel of Discussants while Engr. Mamoud Abubakar, FNSCIE (CEO EEMS Limited) was the Moderator. The occasion was also used to celebrate the 77th Birthday of Dr. Boniface Wada FNSCIE who was born on the 5th June, 1943.
